



## IRS Announces 2022 Limits for FSA, Commuter, QSEHRA, & More

Today, the IRS released [IRS Revenue Procedure 2021-45](#) which provides the 2022 cost-of-living increases/annual limits for a variety of tax-advantaged benefit accounts and programs, **including Flexible Spending Accounts**. For employers who currently allow the FSA maximum, OCA will automatically increase the new FSA maximum to reflect the 2022 IRS increase.

***Note that this announcement did NOT confirm 2022 annual limits for Dependent Care Assistance Program (DCAP) elections. We will follow up if/when more information is received.***

FSA Maximum Rollover	\$550	\$570	\$20
Parking	\$270	\$280	\$10
Transit Monthly Limit	\$270	\$280	\$10

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
