## U.S. Supreme Court Upholds Federal Subsidies for Eligible Consumers Purchasing Coverage through the FFM

Robert A. Marino, chairman and CEO of Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey released the following statement today following the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in *King v. Burwell* to uphold the financial assistance afforded to consumers who purchased a health insurance policy through the Federally Facilitated Marketplace (FFM):

*"Today's Supreme Court ruling means that we at Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey can continue to focus on providing access to quality, affordable health insurance coverage for all of our more than 3.8 million members."*
